Stockholm, 12 May 2017

In 2016-2017, the EMN carried out a study on "Family Reunification of Third-country Nationals in the EU: National Practices". This comparative study looks into the legal framework, policies and practices in the EU Member States and Norway in the light of the EU Directive 2003/86/EC on family reunification.

Persons who have come to Sweden on grounds of family reunification have for a long time constituted a major category of migrants. National public and policy debates have, however, more often centered on asylum seekers. Meanwhile, several recent and ongoing developments have contributed to increased public attention regarding the conditions for family reunification and their consequences.

These developments make a conference on family reunification both timely and topical. The objective of the conference is to discuss recent policy developments and present a broad picture covering both the national situation with regard to family reunification in Sweden and – for comparison – a European perspective. The conference is aimed at practitioners, decision makers, researchers and other stakeholders engaged in migration and family reunification.
